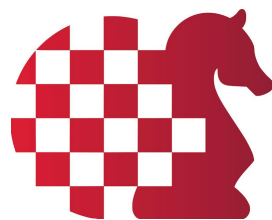


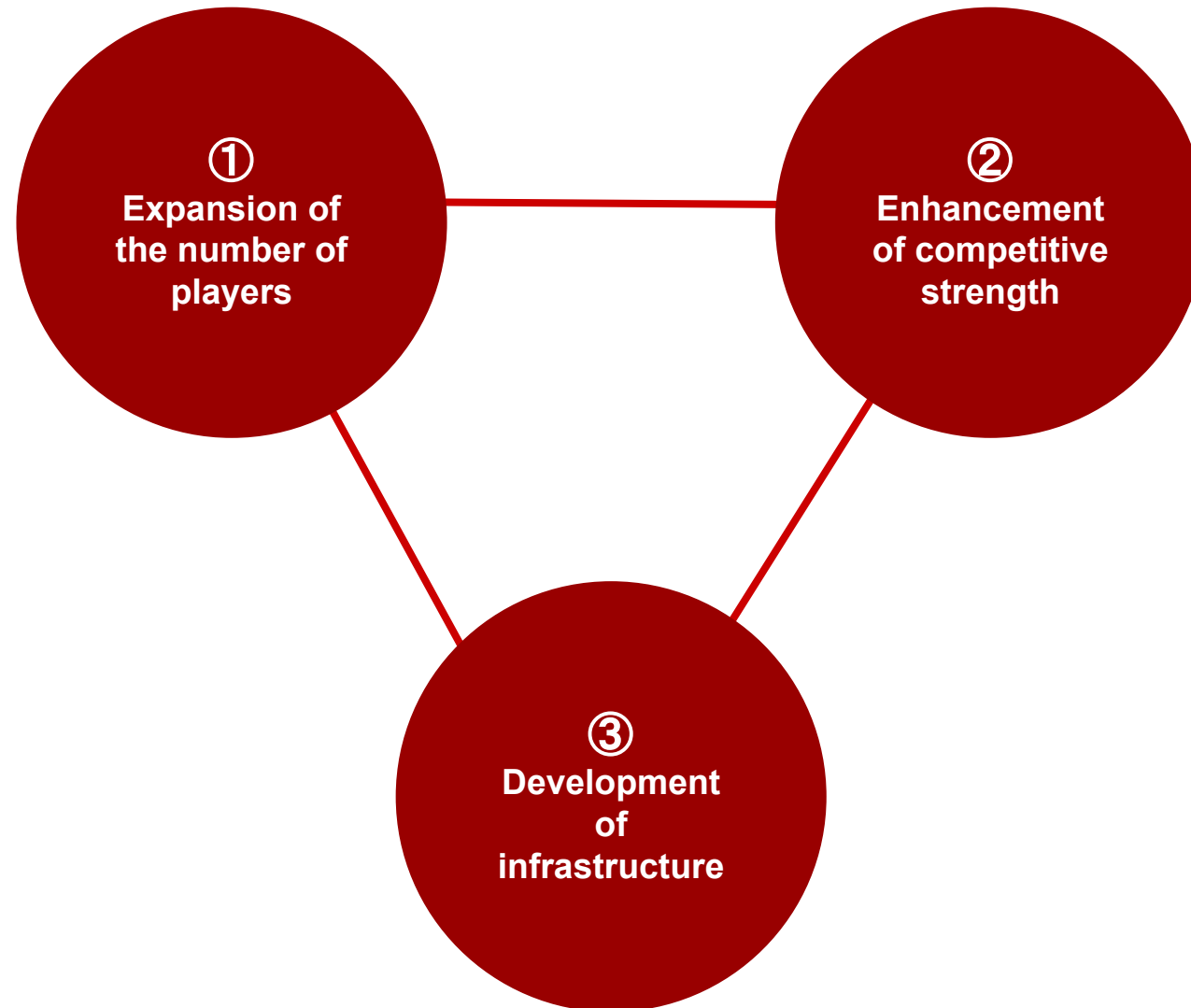

Overview and Three Goals

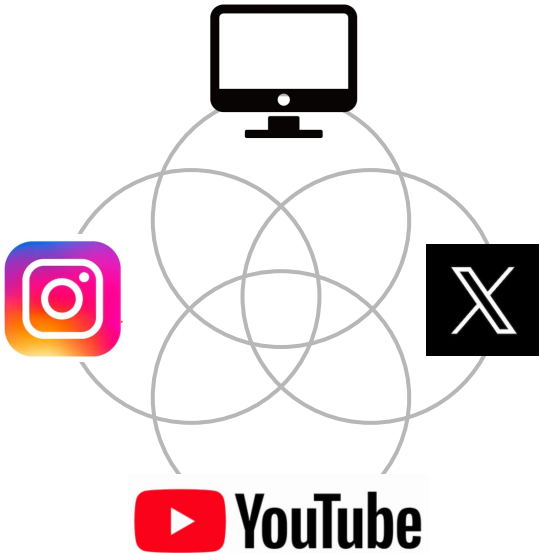
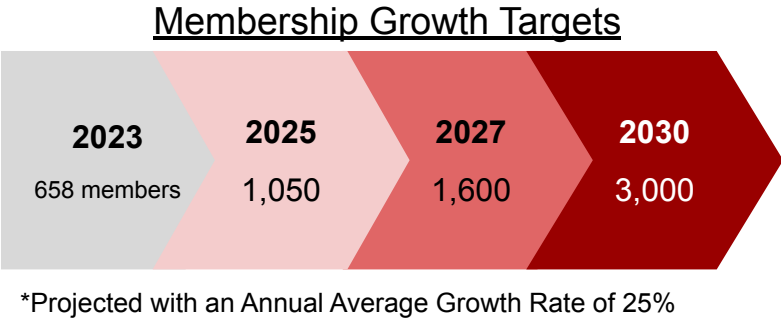
Realize a future where chess will widely penetrate and continue to develop and spread.



Action Plans – Expansion of the Number of Players

Increase opportunities to play chess, regardless of age, gender, or nationality.

Youth	tentative - Donating chess sets and dispatching instructors to schools - Launching Instagram account <planned to launch in February, 2024>
Senior	Lessons and events at culture/community centers
Women	- Holding women-only tournaments and events - Introducing refer-a-friend program
Foreigners	Activation through outreach to the communities (e.g., company, English teacher, researcher etc.)
Others	- Collaboration with influencers - Media approach - Re-enrollment of existing members and promotion of retention



Action Plans – Enhancement of Competitive Strength

Continuously produce globally active players and creating an environment where beginners can learn in a systematic way.

GM/IM production

- Holding norm tournaments in Japan
- Providing support program for talented players

Youth development

- Providing opportunities for interaction and competition (e.g., youth-only tournament/camp)
- Inviting professional coaches from overseas

Development of learning environment

- Creating teaching materials in Japanese
- Training certified instructors
- Subdivision and diversification of achievements
